



At last, the Spring 2011 Sixth Creek Cluster Walk...

THE LAST LEG!

On this walk we are planning to explore the final section of Sixth Creek from the picturesque original settlement of Bungeytown, through to Corkscrew Road, Montacute where there will be a barbecue at Bill Spragg and Erica Womersley's property.

Keen participants may wish to drive approximately 1.3km from here to the end of Corkscrew Road to witness the junction of Sixth Creek with the River Torrens (this last section of road is narrow and winding and not suitable for walking).

Walk Time: 10.30am to 12.30pm (approx)

Bring: salad/sweets/drinks to share (meat provided)

Stretch your legs, explore the last leg of Sixth Creek before it empties into the Torrens and enjoy a convivial barbecue among friends!

Our Plans...

Walk down Fernhurst Road from Cherryville through Bungeytown. Head north along the Sixth Creek Fire Track past Bungay orchards before joining the Heysen Trail. While the watercourse is in relatively good condition until this point there is still a smorgasbord of weeds to admire in the next stretch! Once we reach Valley Road things improve and we can once again see evidence of Sixth Creek's work with recent removal of willows & poplars along the watercourse and other woody weed control/ bushcare work. Walkers are asked to self organise to make car arrangements back to Cherryville after the barbecue.
